THE IMPORTANCE OF DRESSING FOR THE OCCASION

According to the Conference of Catholic Bishops, those attending Mass should be “appropriately dressed”, which means clothing “should not be excessively elaborate or revealing”.

Although there are no official rules about what to wear in Church, “smart casual” or “business casual” are greatly acceptable dress codes when putting together an outfit for Sunday mass. Some people make it easy for themselves by following a job interview dress code. *If you would not wear it to a job interview, you probably should not wear it to church.*

With the warmer summer weather here in Kelowna, please be mindful of your attire in attending the Eucharistic Celebration. Thank you, everyone, for your help in making the Holy Mass a truly prayerful experience for everyone!

THE THIRD WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY will be celebrated this year on **Sunday, 23 July 2023**. Pope Francis inaugurated this World Day to be celebrated by the universal Church each July, either on or near the liturgical Memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, grandparents of Jesus, to help “treasure the spiritual and human wealth that has been handed down from generation to generation”.

Pope Francis’ chosen theme for this year’s World Day is *“His mercy is from age to age”* (Lk 1:50), raising the relational interconnection between the old and the young. The theme is especially fitting in light of the upcoming World Youth Day (WYD) in Lisbon, which will take place from 1-6 August 2023. To showcase this theme, the **CCCB Standing Committee for Family and Life, in tandem with its Office**, produced a 30 second video which captures a group of high school students visiting the elderly at a retirement home. The heartwarming interaction of old and young wonderfully represents this year’s World Day theme and inspires us to find concrete and creative ways to draw near to the elderly.

WHAT DO CATHOLICS ACTUALLY BELIEVE?

Many people don’t really know ... if this describes you or someone you know, **come and discover what our Catholic faith teaches** through the RCIA Program!

The “Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults” is a process through which non-baptized men and women enter the Catholic Church. The classes are also open to those who are missing some sacraments of initiation (eg: Confirmation) and include several stages marked by study, prayer, and rites at Mass. As a group, we journey together in a year of classes where we receive information and get our questions answered.

Taija from the 2022-23 class said this about her experience: *“RCIA was a fantastic gateway into the mystery of our faith as Catholics. For those who want a starting point on getting to know the core values of Catholicism, whether baptised into the faith or not, I found this program to open up numerous doorways for learning and further conversion through group discussion, comradery and informative content.”*

Classes will run from 6:30-8:00ish on **WEDNESDAYS** in the Bedford Room of ICC hall beginning on **September 13, 2023**. Pre-registration is required. For more information, contact Leanne at 250-762-3910 ext 4 or email the parish office.

FALL 2023 PASTORAL CARE TRAINING SESSION

Through our Pastoral Care Ministry, volunteers visit the lonely, homebound, sick, injured, elderly, and dying, in hospitals, extended health care facilities, or at home. Lay pastoral care visitors can assist their pastors by helping to share Christ's healing love and compassion with those in need—in their rawness and vulnerability—by offering friendship, encouragement, the ministry of presence, and, when requested, prayer, and Holy Communion.

The valuable and free **Pastoral Care Outreach Training** series will be offered online again this fall by the Diocese of Victoria Health Care Committee. Nine sessions will be held via Zoom on **Saturday mornings from 9:30 – noon, starting on September 23 and running until November 25, 2023** (with no session on October 7 for Thanksgiving).

Participants who attend all sessions will receive a Certificate of Completion. Participants will require a phone number and email address, a computer, tablet or smartphone with speakers, microphone and webcam, a reliable Internet connection and access to Zoom. Whether you are a member of your parish Pastoral Care Team, an Extraordinary Minister of Communion, a member of the Knights of Columbus, CWL or St. Vincent de Paul, clergy or religious, caring for a family member, or someone attending as a personal undertaking, this training program is important. It will show why those who visit the sick are unique and how they can offer more than a friendly visit – they can be the hands and face of Christ to others. Bishop Gary Gordon of the Diocese of Victoria feels "it is important to have parishioners trained at the ready to provide a caring and compassionate experience to those who are most in need."

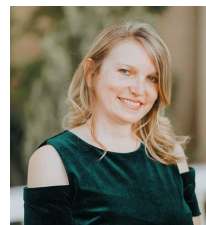

Angelina heads up which may be the only hospice society in B.C. that refuses to participate in assisted suicide, choosing instead to offer care, support, and compassion for those facing end-of-life situations.
